## Community Needs Assessment

This spring, TNLR surveyed the experiences of LGBQ/T folks from MA who may have questioned their safety in their relationship(s). We collected over 3,000 responses from community members around the state! Susan Marine, Associate Professor and Program Director at Merrimack College, calls this project "one of the best examples of broad based program assessment" she's ever seen!

The report that will follow this assessment is an opportunity for organizations to hear directly from our communities about how to provide the best support for LGBQ/T survivors of domestic violence. We are grateful for the support of the LGBQ/T communities in MA, and are excited to share our findings.
